In celebration of the new Men's Prayer Group, I thought it might be eye-opening to glimpse FORMED's "Group Study" ideas.

Go to FORMED.org, then the Programs tab. Near the bottom of the list, click on Knights of Columbus. There you will see *The Search*, which gives a fresh reminder of our belief's foundation, and evidence for it; *Symbolon*, a deeper dive into the faith of the Catholic Church; and *Into the Breach*.

I would especially like to highlight *Into the Breach*, because it is a program developed by the Knights of Columbus - FOR MEN. This is a program that speaks to the roles of men in family life, leadership roles, etc. While we live in a society that wants to water-down the purposes and gifts of men, this program specifically speaks to, and upholds, their important and holy God-given roles. Check it out!

Within the Programs tab, is the Revive Parishes Section, which includes an interesting variety of programs of its own. I am particularly drawn to the Parish Renewal Series, and Chris Stefanick's Evangelization programs. Each of these has two to sixteen brief episodes—each under ten minutes in length—that could be used for discussions.

Tootsie Roll Campaign

The Knights of Columbus “Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities,” better known as The KC Tootsie Roll Drive, will be held this weekend of September 14-15 throughout the State.

The Newton Council 1704 will be participating, and some Robinson-based members will take donations after Masses that weekend, and at the RHS football game on Saturday, September 14th.

All money collected (minus cost of Tootsie Rolls) is kept by the Council to distribute to various charitable organizations in the area. Some recipients in the past have included Special Olympics and Special Education Programs at St. Thomas, and Newton Elementary School. When the Robinson Council was active and at its peak, we raised close to \$5,000 over the weekend.

The Tootsie Roll Drive began in 1970 in Chicago and has become one of the biggest charity projects for the Knights of Columbus. Over those 54 years, the KC has raised hundreds of millions of dollars for this charity.

The Knights of Columbus is a Catholic, family, fraternal organization open to any practicing Catholic man.
