Noise Policy in The House of God

It's always a "balancing act." We adore babies and little ones at Mass — They are "the future of the Church" — and we have no problem with their normal chatter and sweet-baby ways. Still, concerns grow if their volume becomes disruptive to others' ability to hear and follow Sacred Liturgy. (Background noises should particularly be minimal during The Eucharistic Prayer.)

Moms and Dads, if your child is really wound-up, please consider the Cry Room, if only until the child settles. Some older folks with amplified hearing struggle to hear key moments of the Mass if little ones near them get too rambunctious.

Hence, the balancing act: We want everyone in church to feel welcomed and to appreciate the Mass. Consequently, let us continue to do our best as thoughtful neighbors in the Lord, and to be considerate and patient with each other.

As for the St. Elizabeth Cry Room, we hear varying accounts of how the public-address system comes across back there. The system works, but is sensitive. We are told that readers at the ambolectern must project their voices well, and have their mouth fairly close to, and in a straight-line with, the microphone. The sound system is old and aging in our church (in Robinson), a place of worship that for many years had no sound system at all.

Part of noise-concerns, too, is often addressed in this bulletin: Cell phones. Let's try this: Let's simply turn all cell phones completely off during Holy Mass, and this includes the annoying dings and pings of message and notification prompts. So that's our policy: "Cell phones completely off during Holy Mass."

(If you are awaiting word of pending major family news, say involving vital health/surgical outcomes, you may place your phone on "silent vibrate," the only exception to the "cell phones off" policy.)

Let's try this "noise policy," Sisters and Brothers, as we strive to make the House of God more worthy of The Eternal One we honor!

If only praising and worshiping God took-on comparable importance to folks in our modern culture! Talk about "production values" and bold and splashy graphics! Take a look at a laughing baby with her hand wrapped around your little finger! Take a look at a multi-colored glorious sunset! Take a look at a soft snowfall whirling about in a February starlit sky! Our God is infinitely more wondrous than the most exciting *here-today-gone-today* football game! (What is more, He is the one who gives those star athletics their gridiron talent, and their very lives!)
