Sacrament of Marriage


If you are considering marriage, please contact the Parish Office no later than 6 months prior to the proposed wedding date, and the diocesan and parish guidelines will be explained.



From Father David

What is the best gift to give someone? We could debate that one 'til the cows come home. But I think most of us can agree one of the best gifts is the gift of one's time. It's a form of "presence," or "being there."

Now don't get me wrong. Things like beautiful greeting cards and enclosures can be quite meaningful and touching; and letters, often even more so. Yet the gift of self—truly being present to another—involves that component so many of us seem to have less and less of in today's busy world: Time. To give of one's limited time, especially in an in-person visit, or a quality unrushed phone call, is powerful, and even possibly "sacrificial." (Such a gift can be a real sacrifice, when maybe the giver really prefers a nap, or time to relax in solitude!)

How much time do we give the Lord? Do we rush with some brief prayer, perhaps so habitually that we hardly even consider the words' meaning? Or do we enter into a quality exchange, truly contemplating our presence with the Lord, and His presence with us?

We cannot grow in faith without entering into deeper relationship with God. This all takes what today is commonly called "intentionality." --We block out our tendency toward multi-tasking and focus on Jesus, and Him alone.

Many people have a special "quiet place," a comfortable environment or room where they feel safe to engage in this kind of heart-to-heart prayer. Church, before or after Mass, is such an environment. We have also talked about the inimitable power of Eucharistic Adoration; perhaps no prayerful intimacy is more powerful than that, with the exception of actually receiving the Eucharist! In the end, it is all about being present, and the precious gifts of self and time!
