# Letter From the Bishop—DCJH Collection

November 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With a population of over 1.1 million inhabitants, the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois has tens of thousands of people in our midst living in poverty. These men, women and children seldom make the headlines. However, their needs are real and deserve our prayer, action, and financial support.

Our annual Diocesan Collection for Justice and Hope (DCJH) will be taken the weekend of November 23-24, 2024. This collection gives Catholics an opportunity to reach out in solidarity to those who suffer and lack basic human necessities. All funds donated during the DCJH collection are granted to organizations that give realistic hope to the poor to break out of the cycle of poverty.

Like all Catholic ministries, the DCJH grant program reaches out to the broader community, without regard to race, ethnicity or religion. This campaign seeks to address the Gospel command to care for "the least of these" (Matthew 25), and also address the systemic injustices that contribute to poverty.

Please give generously to this DCJH collection and, when possible, reach out in service and solidarity to those organizations that help the poor among us.

May God bless you and reward you with peace, joy, and hope.

# **Special Mass Observances**

On **Thanksgiving Day November 28th**, there will be a Mass of Thanksgiving at 10:00am at St. Elizabeth's.

## **Feast of the Immaculate Conception**

An interesting dynamic—a quirk of the calendar—means The Feast of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9th this year because the 8th is The Second Sunday of Advent, and observed as such.

An OLOL vigil on the 8th would mean four Masses for Father David that day, five for the weekend. (That many Masses is not allowed under Canon Law.) Consequently, Mass in Oblong marking the Feast of the Immaculate Conception—A Holy Day of Obligation—will be at 11:30 AM on Monday, the 9th.

Later that day at 6 PM is the Feast Day Mass in Robinson, the only Mass at St. Elizabeth that day.

(Because these Monday liturgies occur on what is Fr. David's typical day-off, he will take his day on Wednesday, December 11th, so no Mass or Adoration that Wednesday.)

Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception is the patron of not only our diocese, but also of our nation. We need her heavenly maternal care, and we wish to honor her as she so richly deserves.

Missing a Holy Day of Obligation without good reason is a significant sin for which an account must be made before God—our Heavenly Father who gave us our beloved Blessed Mother immaculately conceived without the stain of sin. "Holy Mary, Mother of God, Pray for Us."

Friends, for several months now, folks have commented on positive changes to our parish bulletin. Thank you for expressing this appreciation.

We have tried to add more colorful photos and graphics, including seasonal scenes and images. We have tried to include family-friendly information, including about FORMED programming, and PSR Fellowship Dinners. We have "changed things up" once in a while, including with more colorful front covers.

The bulletin is an official archival document. We hope to get its information as accurate as possible. If there is ever a disparity in our sacramental records, for example, an old bulletin can serve to support sacramental claims and help clear up issues. The bulletin in our digital age is also a wonderful "keeper of history" with its array of parish photos that often become even more valued with time.

I often try to have a column, and am open to considering different topics from others. Columns require time, on top of other creative efforts like homilies and smaller bulletin notices—or "blurbs" as we call them.

When I say "we" I am primarily referring to Patti Buercklin and me as goes the bulletin (although Kathy Staller is great at providing, and proofing, Religious Education information). Patti puts the bulletin's initial skeletal shape together, and then she and I work at the polishing. I give it all a final look-over with sometimes more editing. We do our humble best.

Patti coordinates the Mass Ministers schedule and the daily Mass Intentions, and includes a popular listing: our weekly scriptural readings. Many folks love to reflect on the readings before Mass, and find this prayerful prior reflection a way of making the Mass more personally enriching. Patti also contributes early drafts of saint biography "blurbs;" inspiring pearls-of-wisdom scriptural verses; and does great things with photo montages (including Children's Liturgies, Fish Fries, the Parish Picnic & Pool Party, The Harvest Mass, and the Christmas Party). This week she added a fun little educational quiz kids particularly might enjoy.

In short, Patti is a rock for all of us as goes the bulletin, and often battles deadlines with patience and grace. Please take a moment to thank her for her efforts, which serve all of us, and which "help the trains run on time" around here. She is a true blessing for our parish, as is our other co-office manager, Pam Selby, who does a lot with collections and billings and accounts, on top of other duties, all handled kindly. We have a real dynamic duo in these two great ladies! May God bless them both and their families.
